Benefits to Participation in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

- An opportunity to fall in love with Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and lay a foundation for a deep and meaningful relationship with God that will last a lifetime.
- A solid grounding in the theology and liturgy of the church, that meets the spiritual and developmental needs of the child.
- An opportunity to foster the child's natural spirit of wonder and thankfulness toward God.
- An approach to moral formation, growing out of the child's relationship with God.
- One and a half hours each week for quiet and spiritual reflection and a respite from the busyness of daily life.
- Membership in a community of children and adults seeking to know God together through reflection, prayer, and worship.
- Preparation for "fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 14). This is the foundational aim of each and every activity in the Atrium.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

What is the Catechisis of the Good Shepherd?

CGS is a Montessori-based Catholic faith formation program where children can grow in their relationship with God through a deep engagement in Scripture and liturgy.

God and the Child

CGS is based on the belief that God and the child are already in a relationship. Our work as adults is to provide a place for the child and God to come together and grow.

The Atrium and Materials

The Atrium is a specially prepared room where children can come to know Jesus, the Good Shepherd. The Atrium is prepared with materials children work with as a way of meditating upon the essentials of our faith found in Scripture and in liturgy. Examples of these materials include:

- Small wooden figures of Jesus and the disciples which are used to meditate on the Last Supper
- Detailed interactive maps of the Land of Israel and the City of Jerusalem to help situate Jesus as a real person in time
- Jerusalem Mustard Seeds and beautiful pearls to help ponder the Parables of the Kingdom of God
- A small Baptismal font and Paschal candle used to explore the significance of Baptism.

Generally a session in the Atrium lasts 1 to 1-1/2 hours and includes:

- A presentation including a part of scripture or Liturgy given to the children by the Catechist.
- A significant period of time for children to work with materials of their own choice as an aid to meditation and prayer.
- A gathering time of worship at the prayer table.
